## *Our Teas*

### *Jacksons of Piccadilly*

Jacksons of Piccadilly is a London tea house, begun by Robert Jackson in 1815. Over its history it has earned an impressive collection of Royal Warrants, from Queen Victoria, King George V and numerous other royals through the 19th and 20th centuries. The company also claims (although this is contested) to have invented the “original” recipe for Earl Grey tea.

### *Twining's*

Since they first started business in 1706, Twinings have been using their blending expertise to create high quality teas that now, nearly 300 years later, are enjoyed in over 100 different countries across the world. Twinings' founder Thomas Twining first began selling tea from premises on The Strand in London, which remains today. Word of this exotic, new drink quickly spread and soon Twinings' tea was de rigueur - eighteenth century English novelist Jane Austen and Chares II Earl Grey were fans.

### *Tregothnan Estate for English Teas*

Translated from the Cornish language “Tregothnan” means ‘The House at the Head of the Valley’ and the beating heart of the Estate is the Private Botanic Garden. The belief in doing things well has persevered at Tregothnan: the Estate has stayed within the same family since 1335. Seven years of trials have been undertaken to achieve these fine teas that really deserve the accolade ‘English Tea’!
